Statement on filing a complaint on an extrajudicial killing case for the United Nations' Special Rapporteur

The Syrian Network for Human Rights (SNHR), founded in June 2011, is a non-governmental, independent group that is considered a primary source for the OHCHR on all death toll-related analyses in Syria.

The Syrian Network for Human Rights informed the United Nations Special Rapporteur on the extrajudicial killing on the case of the citizen Ahmad Mohammad Amin al Najjar, from Talbisa city in Homs governorate, born in 1975, as he was shot by bullets of Syrian regime forces in Talbisa city, which was controlled by Syrian regime forces at the time of the incident on April 29, 2011.

The Syrian Authorities didn't admit to killing the citizen, and his family couldn't submit a complaint out of fear of security pursuit as Ahmad was participating in a protest against head of Syrian regime.

SNHR confirmed its fear of the killing of civilians from the year 2011, and the victims' numbers are continuously rising.








